Update from Carl and Betsy Stevens

We had a peaceful fall visiting France, Spain and Morocco. Recently, we made the passage to the Canary Islands. The same day we left the strait of Gibraltar another sailboat was sunk after a 45 minute orca attack. It happened just a few hours before we sailed by the same spot. We didn't know about the incident until a couple of days later. Ignorance is bliss!

We're currently in Santa Cruz, Tenerife. We've had some stunning hikes and are enjoying the city quite a bit. The marina we are staying at is filled with all sizes of boats getting ready to cross to the Caribbean. We've seen 30 footers to 200' multi masted schooners making preparations. It's an exciting place to be! We plan to get underway for Martinique around Thanksgiving. Sailor lore has it that we should sail south until the butter melts and then head west. That's our plan more or less. We're looking forward to those steady north east trade winds.



If all goes according to plan (it never does), it should take around 18 days to make the crossing. Wish us luck!
